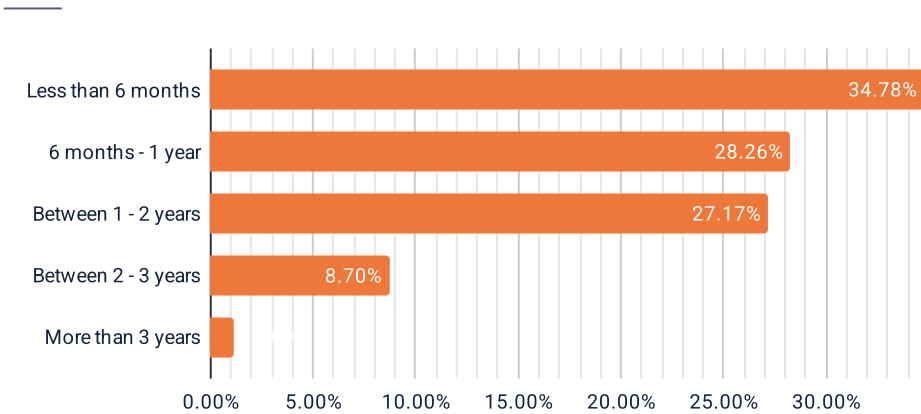

THE BIG QUESTIONS

WINTER 2025

The Big Questions is the Foyer Federation's bi-annual survey of young people living in our member Youth Foyers.



In December 2025 / January 2026, we received a total of 92 responses from 13 Youth Foyers. The responses came from: Blackburn with Darwen, YMCA Cheshire, Bridge Foyer, Coops Foyer, Salford Foyer, Sheffield Foyer, Redruth Foyer, Ravenhead Foyer, North Devon Projects, Isle of Wight Foyer, Verve Place and CHADD On Route Foyer.

Most young people who responded had been at their Foyer for less than 6 months.

The diverse range of responses highlights the unique experiences and perspectives of young people in Foyers across different regions, providing useful insights into the challenges and opportunities they encounter.

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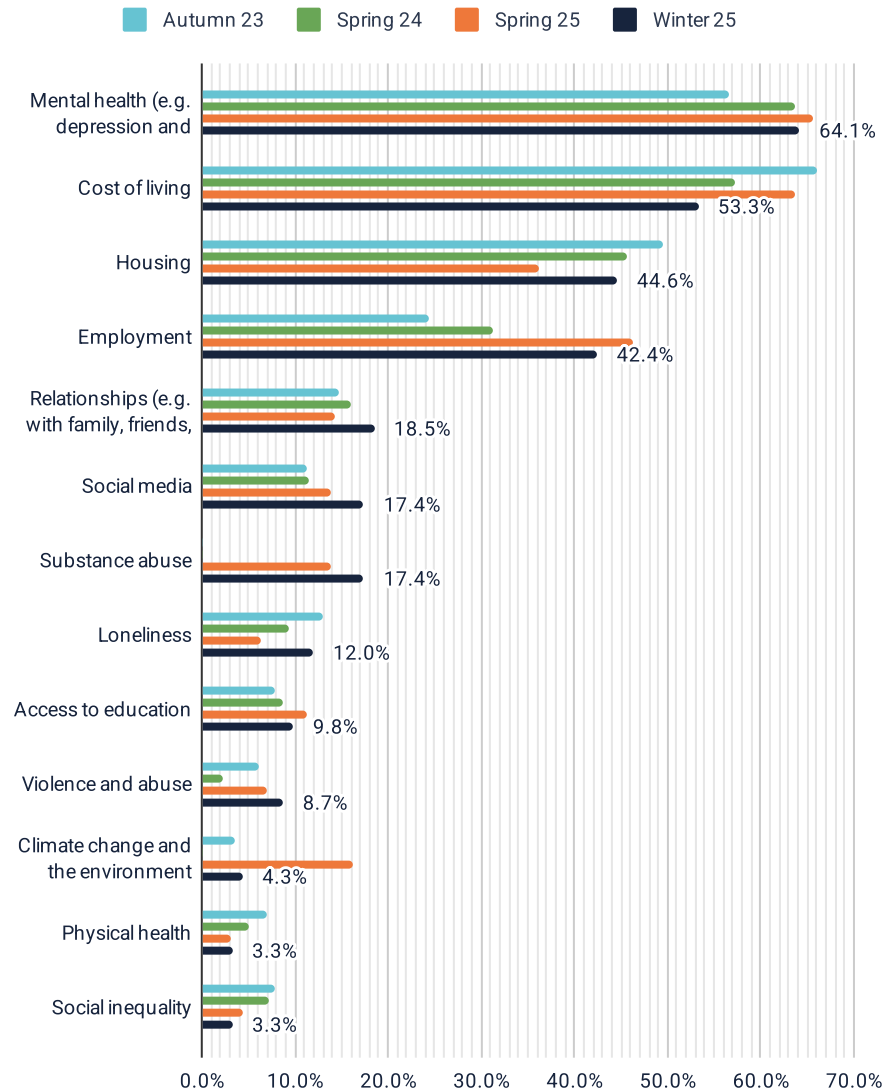
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Section One:

What's important to you?

We asked about what's important, exciting and worrying for young people at this moment in their lives.

What are the three biggest challenges facing young people today?



We ask this question in every survey so that we can look at trends in responses.

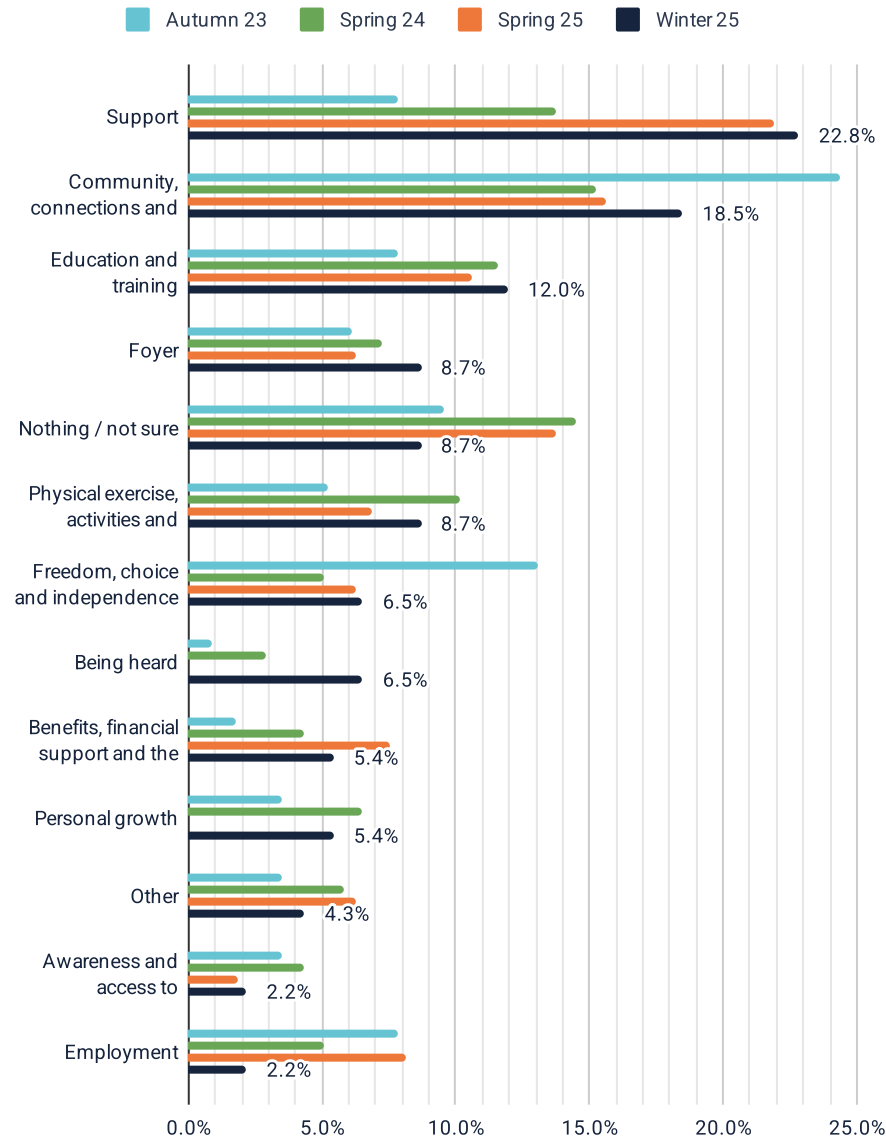
The top two biggest challenges that young people face today remain unchanged from spring 2025, with mental health and cost of living still receiving the most votes.

In the three surveys since spring 2024, housing and employment have competed for the third biggest challenge. This year, housing has received a higher proportion of the vote whereas a lower - but still significant - percentage of young people reported that employment was one of their three biggest challenges.

In spring 2025, we saw the proportion of young people concerned about social media increase and this upward trend has continued in winter 2025.

We are also seeing more young people report relationships, loneliness and substance abuse as concerns.

What do you think is positive for young people right now?



The responses to this question are submitted through a free text box. We have grouped the responses to identify trends, and you can find each response in the appendix at the end of this document.

Following the same trend we saw in spring 2025, young people continue to value the support they receive, and the number of people specifically mentioning their Foyer has increased.

Since spring 2024, we've also seen a rise in positive feelings about community, connections and social media and education and training. We've also seen the percentage of young people who could not think of any positives decrease from 13.8% in spring 2025 to 8.7%.

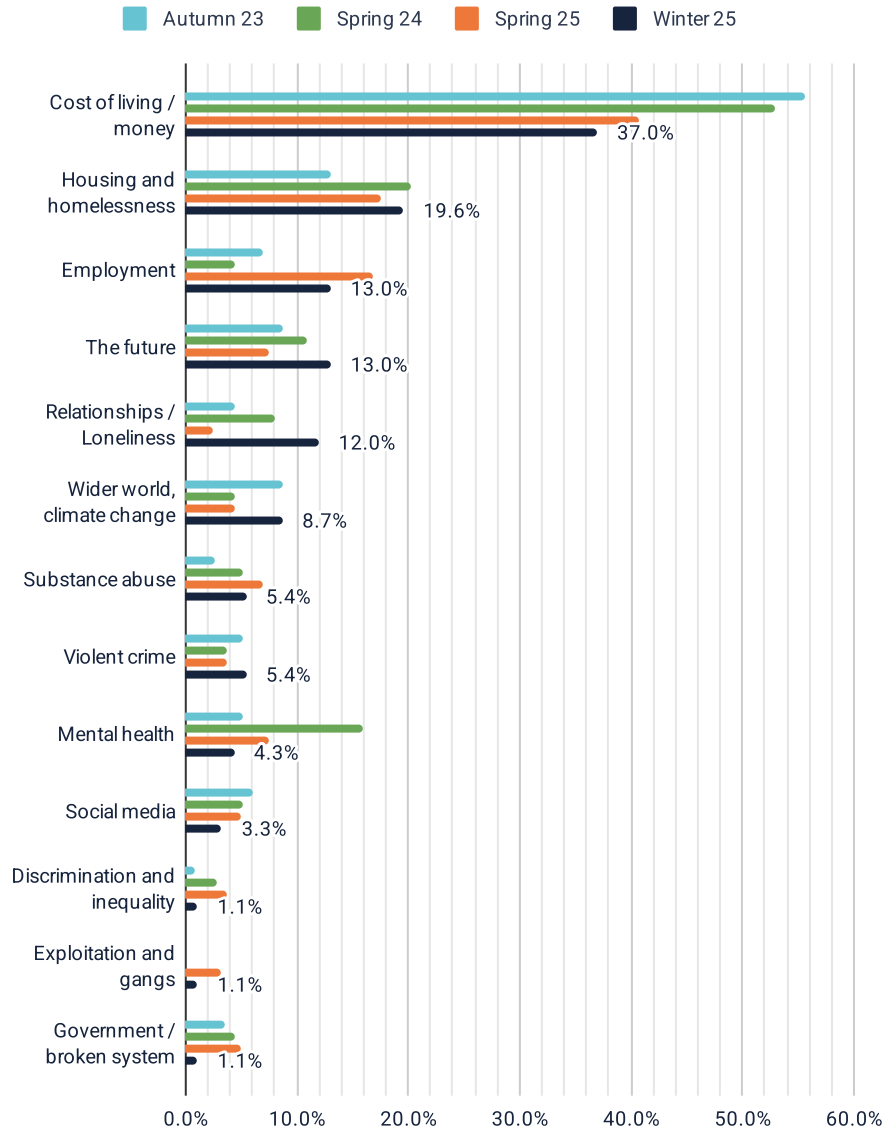
A higher percentage responded that having their voices heard was positive for young people right now, however a much smaller percentage reported employment as a positive compared to the last three surveys.

What do you think is worrying for young people right now?



The responses to this question are submitted through a free text box. We have grouped the responses to identify trends, and you can find each response in the appendix at the end of this document.

Cost of living and money issues continues to be the biggest worry for young people surveyed, however, following the downward trend from spring 2025, the percentage of people reporting this as a concern has fallen again, from 40.6% to 37.0%.

Housing and homelessness, and employment have held their positions as second and third most concerning issues to young people and, along the same vein, we have seen a higher percentage of young people reporting that they are worried about their futures.

However, we have again seen an increase in the percentage of young people reporting relationships and loneliness as a worry, up from 2.5% in spring 2025 to 12.0% in winter - the highest rating we have seen for this issue since lockdown in 2020.

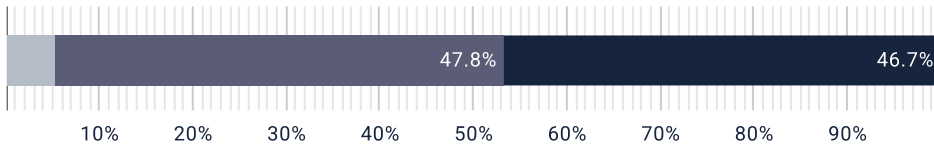
Section Two:

Environment & Culture

We asked young people about their view of their Youth Foyer, the way it feels and their experience of the staff who work with them. Some of the questions asked are directly linked to the Youth Foyer Quality Standards.

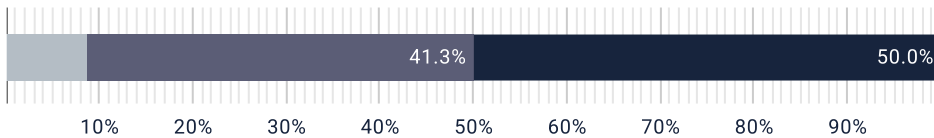

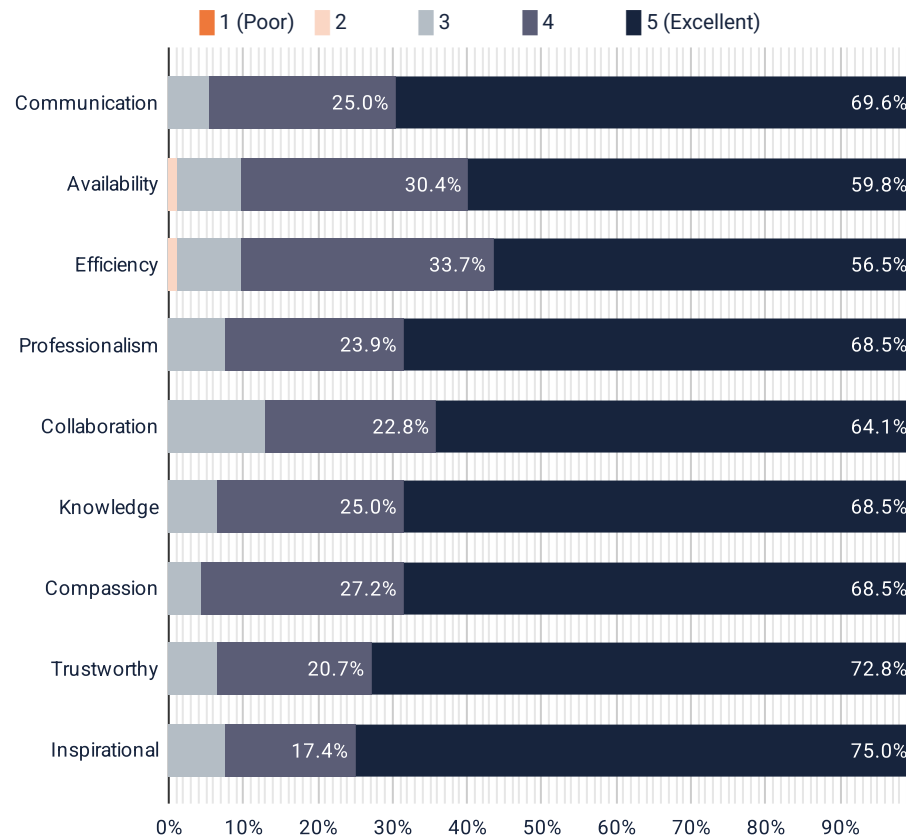


94.6% of the young people who responded to this survey agreed or strongly agreed that staff in their Youth Foyer trust and believe in them, with no one disagreeing.

This suggests that staff in the Youth Foyers represented through this survey are working in an Advantaged Thinking way, communicating their belief in and aspirations for young people effectively.

91.3% of the young people who responded agreed or strongly agreed that they have been able to create a space that they feel proud of within the Youth Foyer, again with no one disagreeing. This suggests that their Youth Foyers are offering a high quality physical environment, for and co-created by their residents, giving young people a sense of ownership over the space.

How would you rate staff in your Youth Foyer in each of the following areas?



All areas were rated good (4 or 5) by the majority of young people who responded to this survey. However, it is worth bearing in mind that there is a risk of bias: for example, those who might rate their Youth Foyer poorly in communication and collaboration may be less likely to complete the Big Questions survey.

The two highest-rated areas were compassion (95.7%) and communication (94.6%), with knowledge and trustworthiness tied for third place at 93.5%.

The attribute receiving the fewest good ratings was collaboration, with 13.0% rating it 3/5.

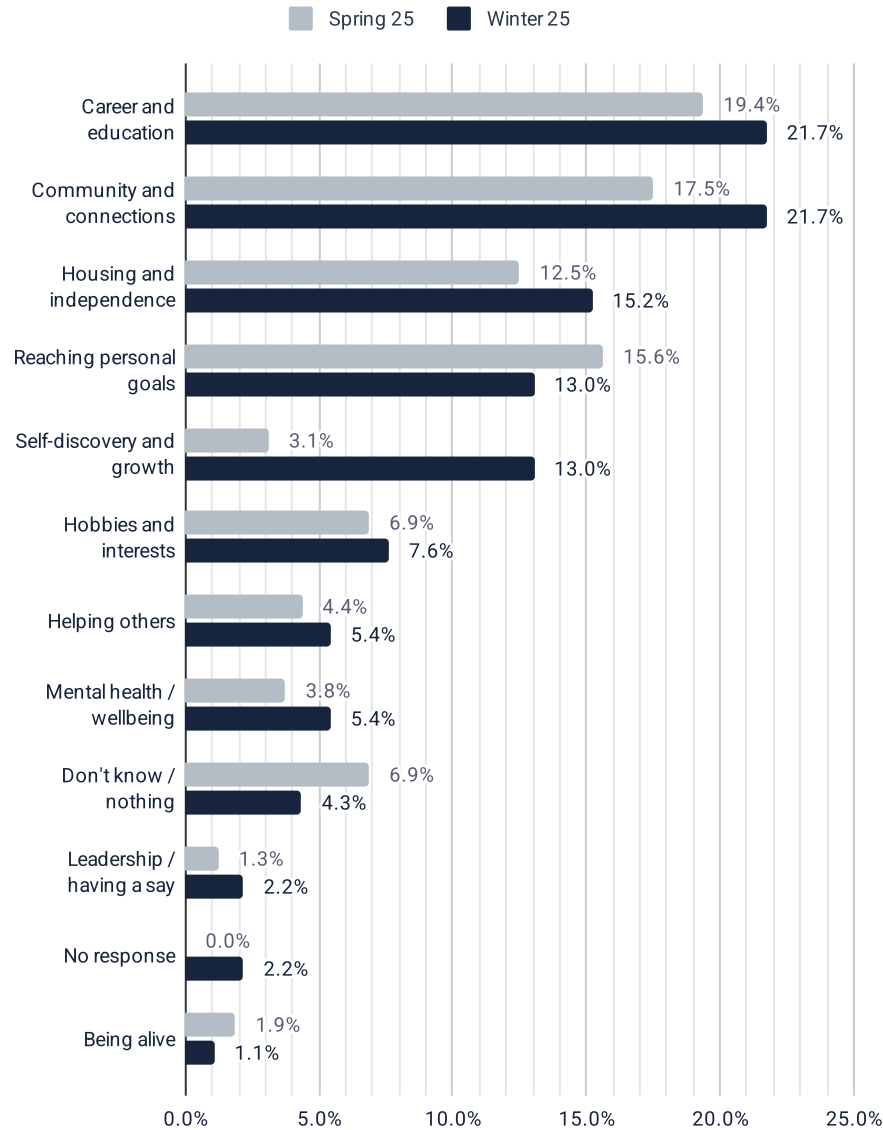
However, while 90.2% of young people rated efficiency as good, it was the lowest rated overall, with 1.1% rating it 2/5 and 8.7% rating 3/5.

Section Three:

Purpose & Development

We asked young people about what gives them a sense of purpose, their hopes and ambitions, and areas they're interested in developing.

What gives you a sense of purpose and achievement in your life?



The responses to this question are submitted through a free text box. We have grouped the responses to identify trends, and you can find each response in the appendix at the end of this document.

Similarly to spring 2025, the most popular responses to this question were career and education, and community and connections, the latter now rated equally as important.

We have seen a slight increase in the percentage of young people reporting that housing and independence give them a sense of purpose and achievement but the most significant increase is in self-discovery and growth, rising from 3.1% in spring 2025 to 13.0% in winter.

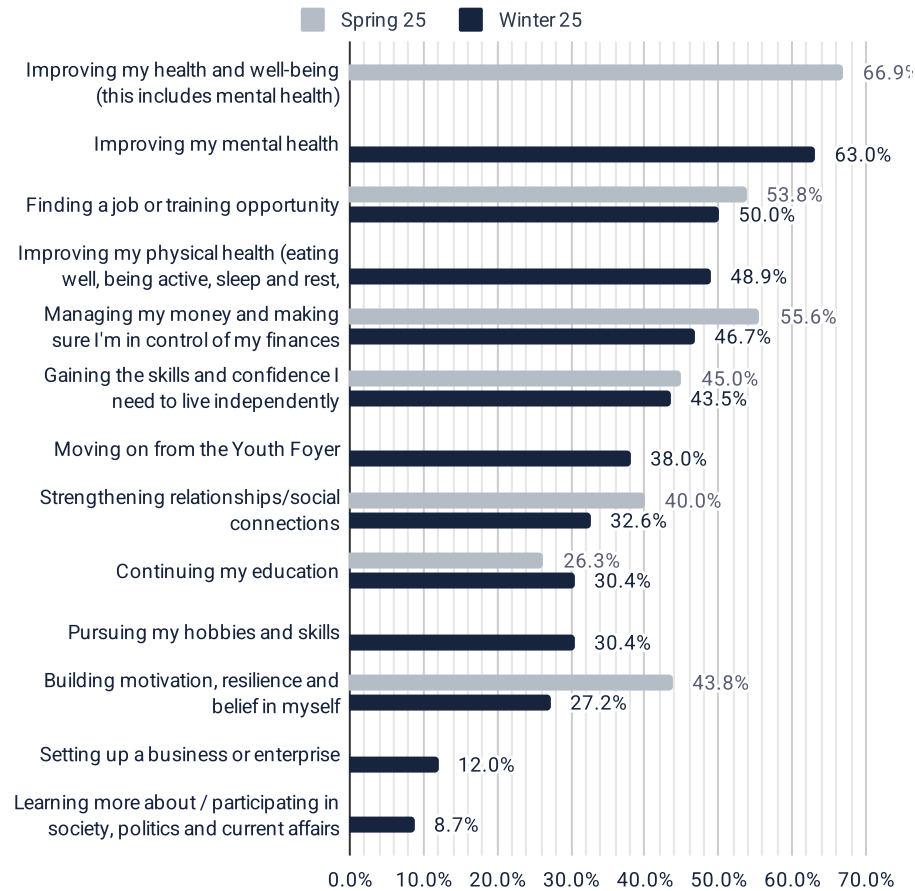

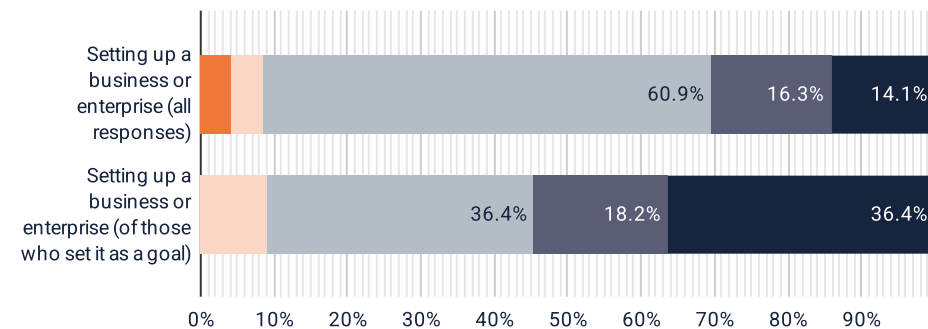
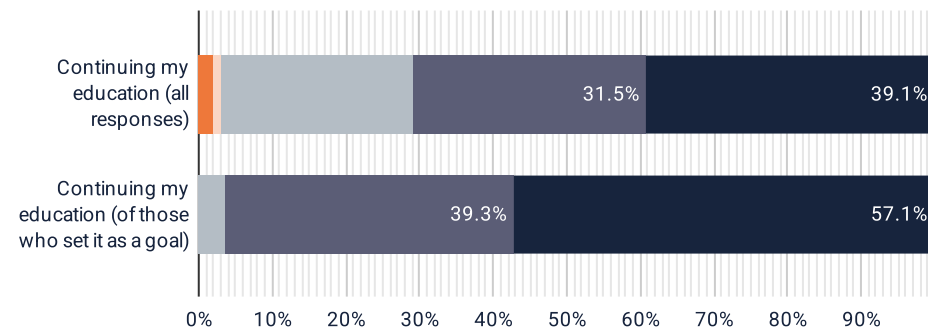
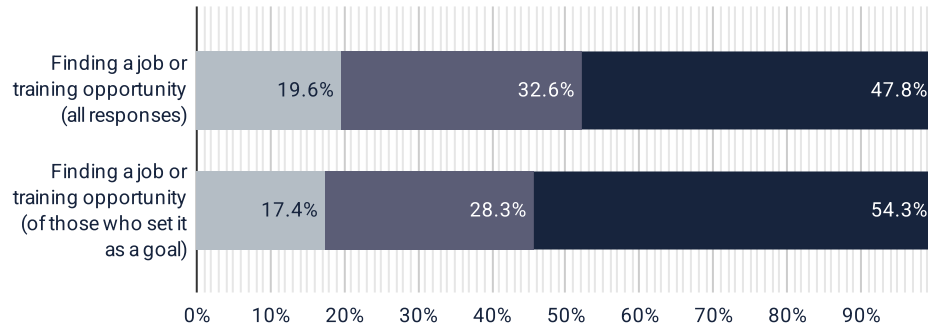
In spring 2025, the majority of young people (66.9%) reported personal goals that related to improving their health and wellbeing. For this survey, we have categorised these responses into mental health and physical health, with both receiving high responses at 63.0% and 48.9% respectively.

In this survey, we saw the percentage of young people reporting goals relating to money management decrease by 8.9% but still remain significant at 46.7%, and goals relating to building self-motivation, resilience and belief drop by 16.6% to 27.2%. We also saw young people report goals not previously reported, including moving on from the Youth Foyer (38.0%) and pursuing hobbies and skills (30.4%). We have also seen that 12.0% of young people who responded aim to set up their own business or enterprise.

However, while a good majority (75.8%) of young people agreed or strongly agreed that their Youth Foyer was supporting them towards these goals, this is a decrease of 10.4% compared to spring 2025. In the following pages, you can see a breakdown of how young people felt about the support they received for different types of goal.

For goals relating to employment and education, the majority of young people either agree or strongly agree that their Youth Foyer is helping them.

80.4% of all young people who responded to this survey and 82.6% of young people with a goal relating to finding a job or training opportunity agreed or strongly agreed that the Youth Foyer was helping them move towards it.

70.7% of all young people and 96.4% of young people who said that continuing their education was a personal goal agreed or strongly agreed that the Youth Foyer was helping them move towards it.

However, of the young people who said that setting up a business or enterprise was a personal goal, only 54.5% agreed that their Youth Foyer was helping them move towards it.

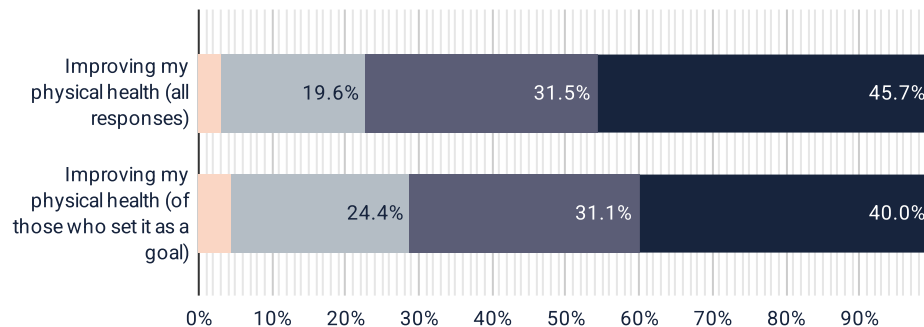
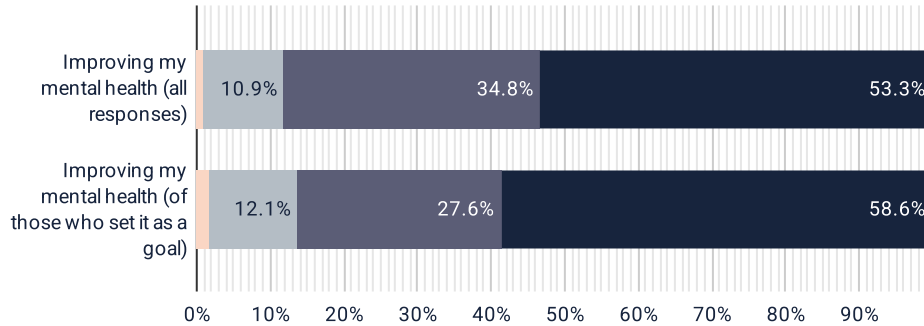
To address this, Youth Foyers can explore the 'Employment, Education & Enterprise' section of the Youth Foyer Learning Framework to find learning outcomes and example sessions to develop a learning offer that supports young people to pursue self-employment.

For goals relating to health and wellbeing, the majority of young people either agree or strongly agree that their Youth Foyer is helping them.

88.0% of all young people who responded to this survey and 86.2% of young people who set improving their mental health as a goal agreed or strongly agreed that their Youth Foyer was helping them move towards it.

For young people with goals to improve their physical health, we saw lower ratings: 77.2% of all young people and 71.1% of those with specific goals agreed or strongly agreed.

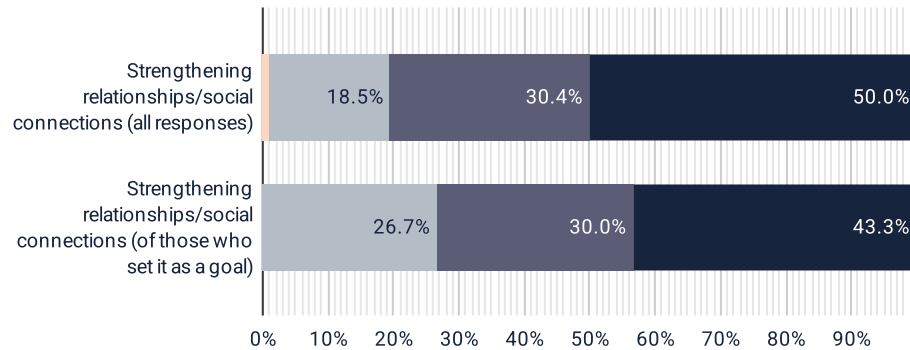
To address this, Youth Foyers can explore the 'Health & Wellbeing' section of the Youth Foyer Learning Framework to find learning outcomes and example sessions to help develop a learning offer that supports young people to make positive progress in their health and wellbeing.

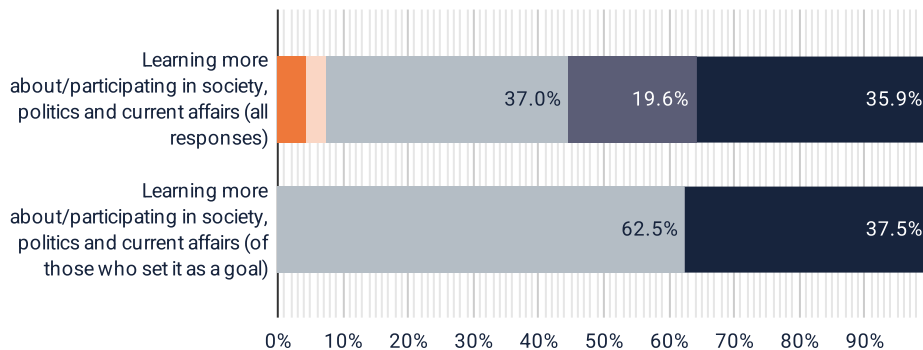
For goals relating to relationships and the wider world, results are more mixed.

80.4% of all young people who responded to this survey and 73.3% of young people who set goals to strengthen relationships and social connections agreed that the Youth Foyer was helping them move towards this.

However, for young people with goals to learn more about or participate in society, politics and current affairs, just 37.5% agreed that their Youth Foyer was helping them and 7.6% of all young people who responded disagreed or strongly disagreed.

To address this, Youth Foyers can explore the 'Wider World' section of the Youth Foyer Learning Framework to find learning outcomes and example sessions to help develop a learning offer that supports young people to learn more about participation in society, politics and current affairs.

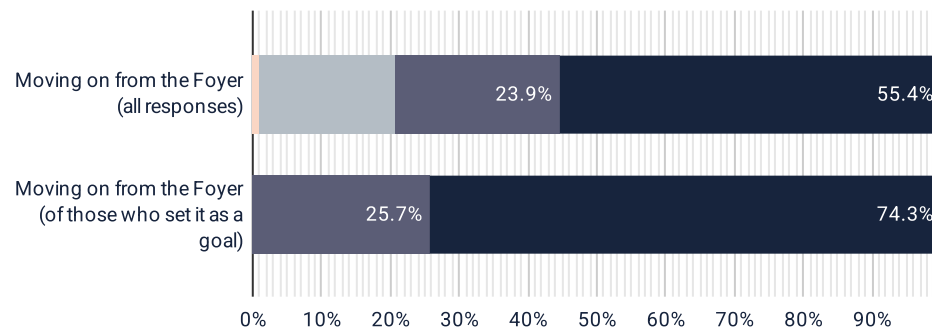
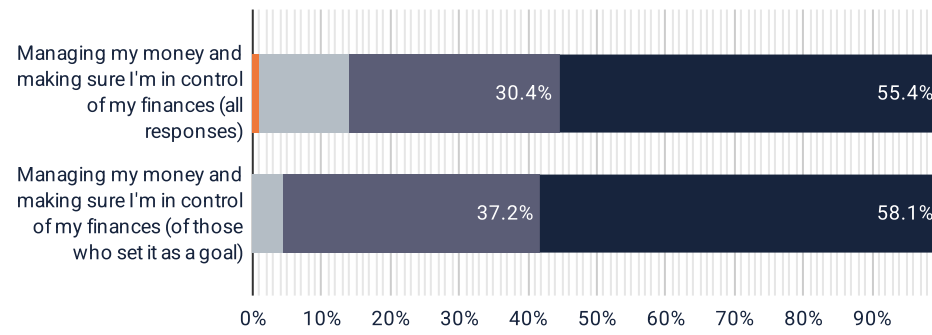
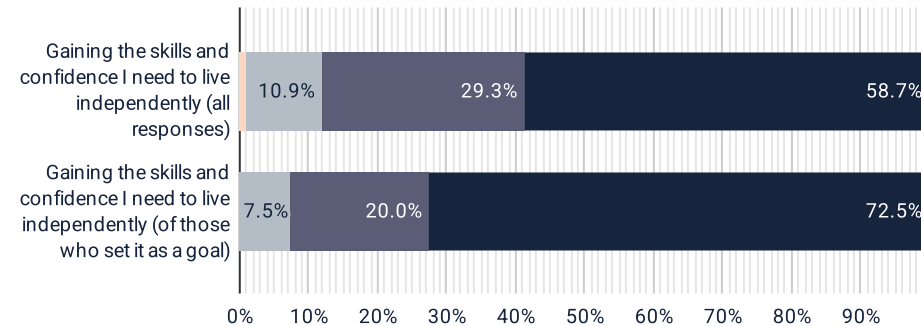

For goals relating to living independently, the majority of young people agreed that their Youth Foyer was helping them.

88.0% of all young people who responded to this survey and 92.5% of young people who set goals to gain skills and confidence for living independently agreed or strongly agreed that the Youth Foyer was helping them move towards this.

85.9% of all young people and 95.3% of those with goals relating to managing money and making sure they are in control of their finances agreed that their Youth Foyer was helping them make progress.

Encouragingly, 79.3% of all young people and 100% of those with goals to move on agreed or strongly agreed that their Youth Foyer was helping them with this.

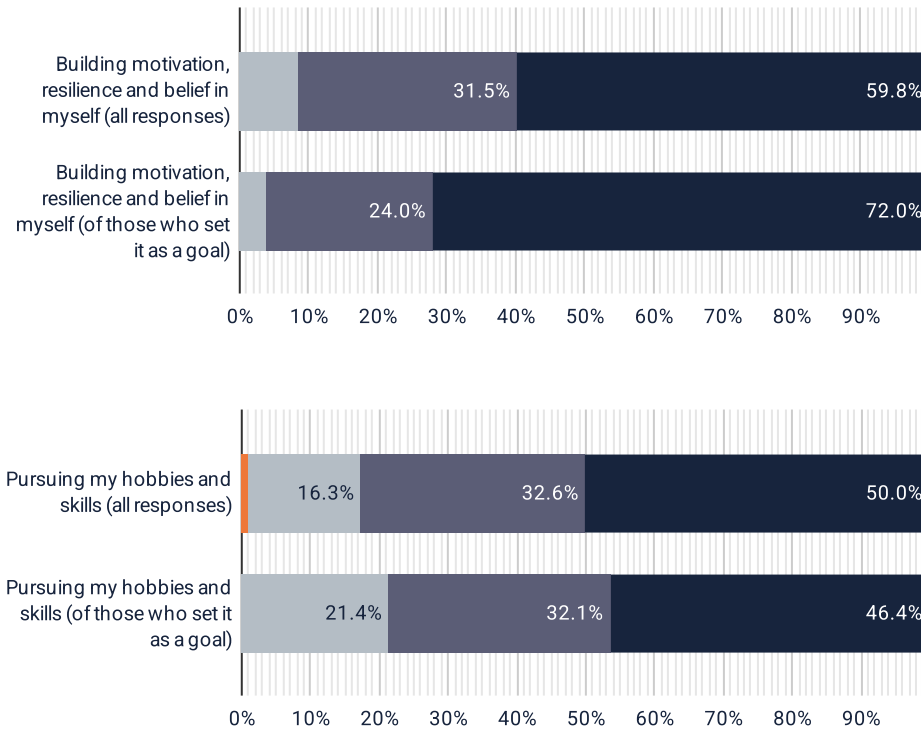

For goals relating to understanding and expressing themselves, the majority of young people agreed or strongly agreed that their Youth Foyer was helping them.

91.3% of all young people who responded and 96.0% of young people with goals relating to building motivation and belief in themselves agreed that their Youth Foyer was supporting them to move towards their goal.

However, while 82.6% of all young people who responded agreed that their Youth Foyer was supporting them to pursue their hobbies and skills, a lower proportion of those who set this as a goal agreed with the statement (78.6%).

For information and guidance on developing a learning offer that supports young people with goals in this area, Youth Foyers can explore the 'Understanding & Expressing Yourself' section of the Youth Foyer Learning Framework.

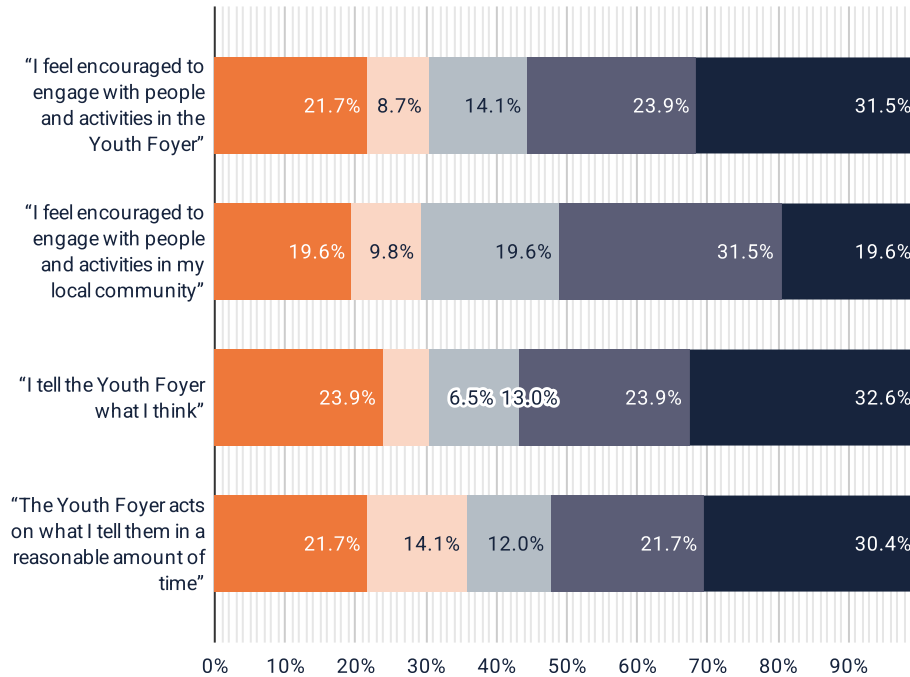
Section Four:

Involvement & Influencing

We asked young people to tell us how well they feel listened to and how much they feel they can make change happen in their Youth Foyer.

How much do you agree with the following statements?

While over half of young people agree with all four statements, we have seen an increase in young people who strongly disagree across the board.

30.4% of young people disagreed that they felt encouraged to engage with people and activities in their Youth Foyer, up from 11.3% in spring 2025.

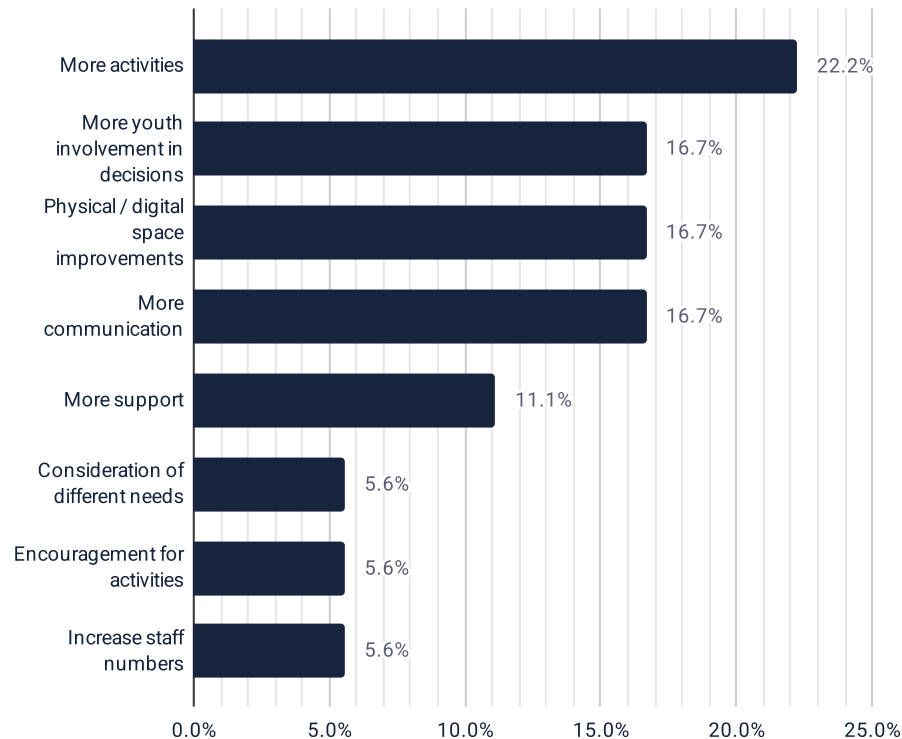
29.3% of young people disagreed that they felt encouraged to engage with people and activities in their local community, up from 20.6% in the last survey.

30.4% disagreed that they tell their Youth Foyers what they think, up from 12.5%, and 35.9% disagreed that their Youth Foyer acts on what they tell them in a reasonable amount of time, up from 10.0% in spring 2025.

It is important to bear in mind, however, that the sample size for the winter 2025 survey was significantly smaller, with lower representation from across the Youth Foyer Network. We encourage individual Youth Foyers to reflect not just on the national average but on the results from their individual Big Questions report to understand which areas they may be able to build on.

"I strongly agree because the Youth Foyer supports me to build confidence and explore opportunities in my local community. They provide encouragement, information, and reassurance, which helps reduce my anxiety and makes engaging with community activities feel more manageable."

Would you like to share any suggestions for improving the service or for how staff engage and inspire you?



The responses to this question are submitted through a free text box. We have grouped the responses to identify trends, and you can find each response in the appendix at the end of this document.

Of the responses given, the most frequently made suggestions were around creating more activities for young people to participate in within the Youth Foyer.

16.7% of the suggestions related to involving young people more in decisions; improving the physical space; and communicating more with young people.

"To improve the service further, it could be helpful to have more optional group activities or workshops that focus on confidence building, wellbeing, and practical life skills, with flexibility for people who may feel anxious in group settings."

"Actually take on board what the young people say. And have fair rules for everyone. Parents and baby unit get 3 overnight stays a week, but 16-25 year olds upstairs who live on their own get 4 per month. For those living on their own social isolation is harder."

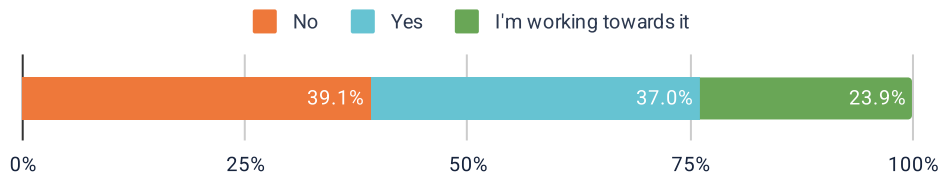
"The supportive and non judgemental way staff engage already inspires me, and building on this with consistent encouragement and choice would make the service even stronger."

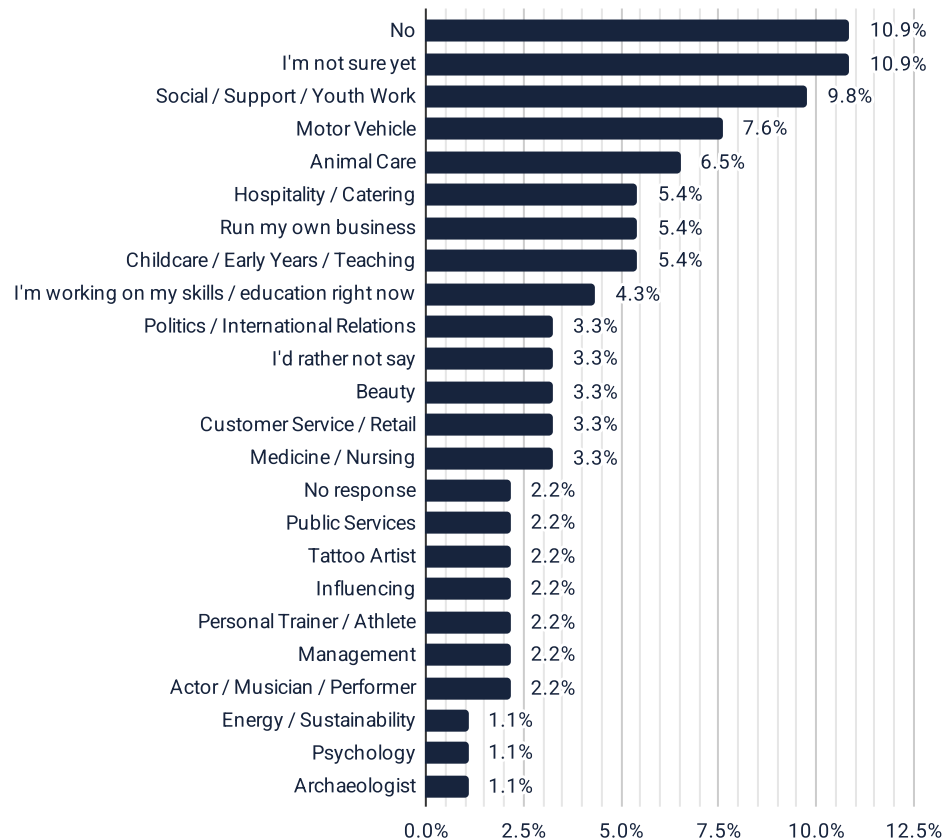
Employment, Education & Enterprise

We asked young people about their career goals and aspirations, how they felt about the support they are receiving, and what support would be most useful to them.

Are you currently in education, employment or training?



Do you have a career in mind that you would like to work towards?



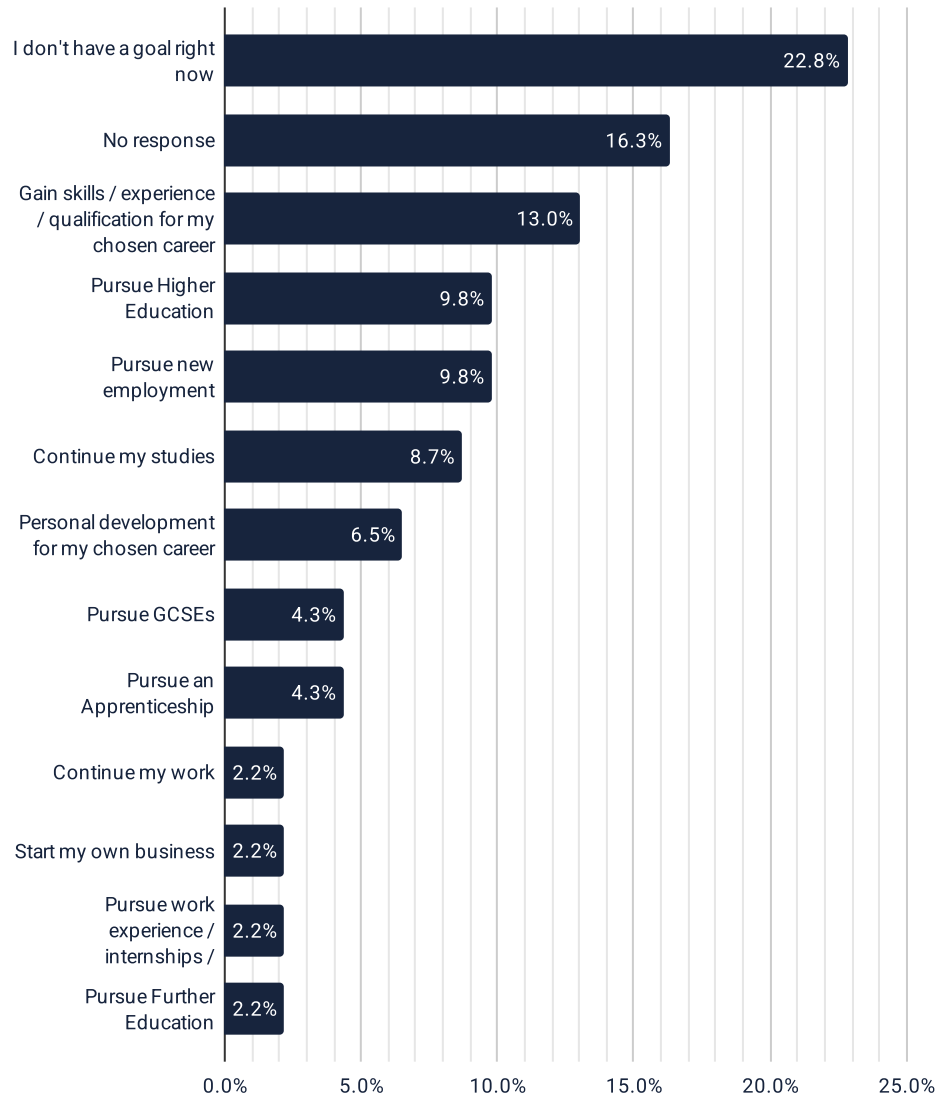
The responses to this question are submitted through a free text box. We have grouped the responses to identify trends, and you can find each response in the appendix at the end of this document.

Of the young people who responded to the survey, 37.0% were currently in education, employment or training, 23.9% said they were working towards it and 39.1% said that they were not.

The most popular career ambitions were social / support / youth work (9.8%) and motor vehicle (7.6%), with animal care taking third spot (6.5%).

However, 10.9% of young people said that they did not have a career in mind and another 10.9% said they weren't sure yet. This could mean that more information, advice and guidance in Youth Foyers relating to careers could help young people identify career ambitions.

The responses to this question are submitted through a free text box. We have grouped the responses to identify trends, and you can find each response in the appendix at the end of this document.

When asked about their employment or education goals, 13.0% said that they were currently gaining skills, experience or qualifications relating to their career ambitions. This included job-specific training and certifications such as CSCS cards.

9.8% said that they were pursuing higher education and another 9.8% said that they were currently pursuing new employment.

6.5% said that they were prioritising personal development to help them move towards their chosen career, such as working on their wellbeing or moving on. However, 22.8% said that they did not have a goal relating to employment or education right now.

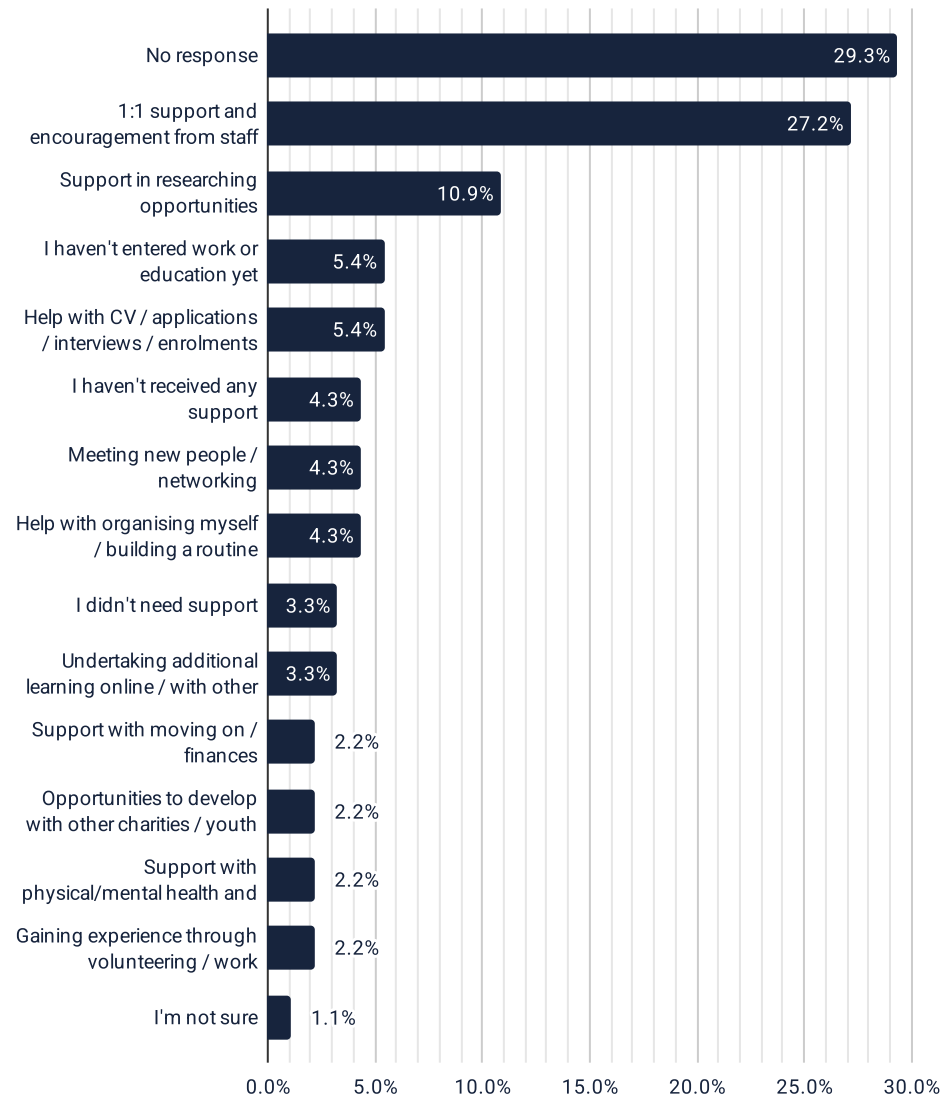

27.2% of young people said that 1:1 support and encouragement from staff in their Youth Foyer was the most useful support for moving towards employment.

The second most useful was support in researching opportunities (10.9%).

"Mental health support."

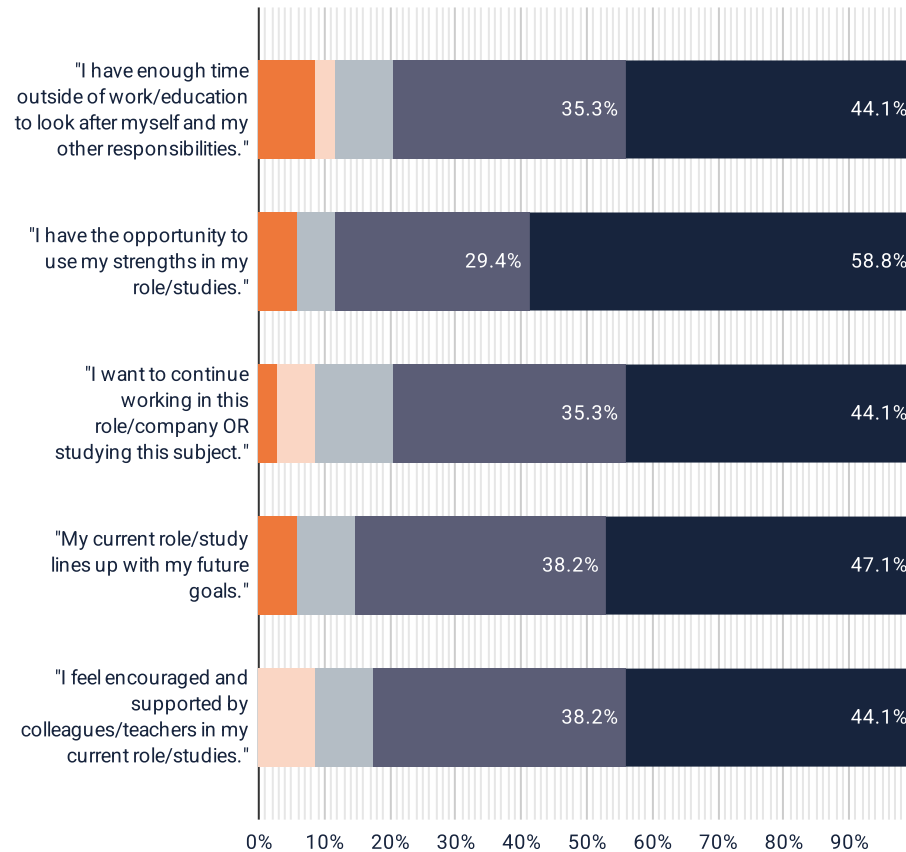

We asked these questions to gain insights into how young people sustain employment or education.

79.4% of young people currently in work or education agreed or strongly agreed that they had enough time outside of work or education to look after themselves and their other responsibilities, however 11.8% disagreed with the statement.

Encouragingly, the statement that young people agreed with most (88.2%) was that they had the opportunity to use their strengths in their role or studies.

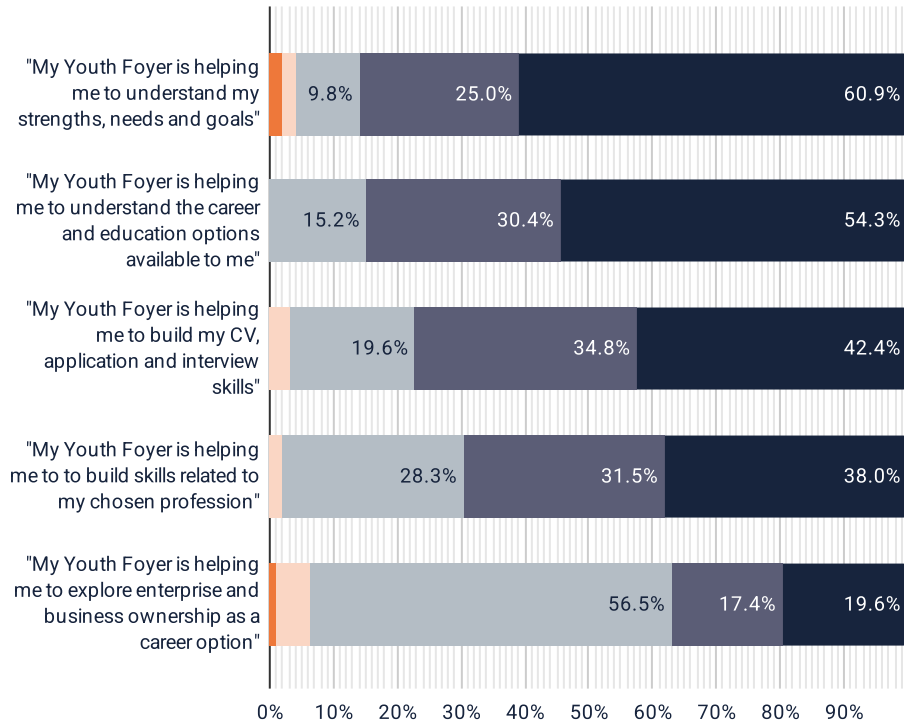
79.4% agreed that they wanted to continue working in their current role/company or studying their subject, and 85.3% agreed that this lined up with their future goals.

82.4% felt encouraged and supported by their colleagues or teachers.

While overall sentiment from young people around their work and/or studies is high and therefore indicates that there is a strong likelihood that the young people who responded will sustain their employment, there is definitely some room for development. It might be worth checking in with young people who are already in work or education to see where they might value some support and guidance.

"Overall, I feel supported in exploring education, employment, and skills development at the Youth Foyer."

"Staff regularly update the job board with current job vacancies in our area and I think it's amazing how they put time into finding the current vacancies for us young people."

"I really don't want to go back into education but will welcome advice and support about volunteering and employment."

85.9% of all young people we surveyed agreed or strongly agreed that their Youth Foyer is helping them to understand their strengths, needs and goals, while 4.4% disagreed.

84.8% of young people agreed or strongly agreed that their Youth Foyer is helping them to understand the career and education options available to them - and no one disagreed.

77.2% agreed that their Youth Foyer is helping them to build their CV, application and interview skills, which leaves some room to build on.

69.6% of young people agreed that their Youth Foyer is helping them to build skills related to their chosen profession. While this might appear lower than other scores, it's important to remember that 21.7% previously reported that they either did not have a career goal or that they weren't sure yet, so it's expected that this response would be lower than others.

However, only 37.0% of young people agreed that their Youth Foyer was helping them to explore enterprise and business ownership as a career option. The Youth Foyer Learning Framework includes learning outcomes and example sessions that could help Youth Foyers to develop a learning offer that supports young people to explore self-employment as an option.
